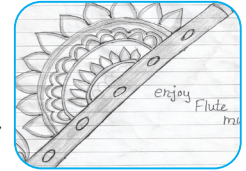

## Inter House Activities

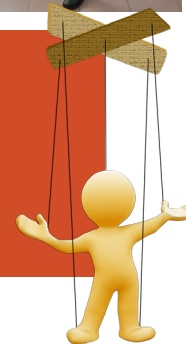

## Protecting Our Future - Understanding the POCSO Act

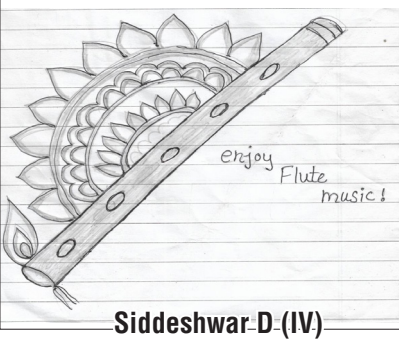

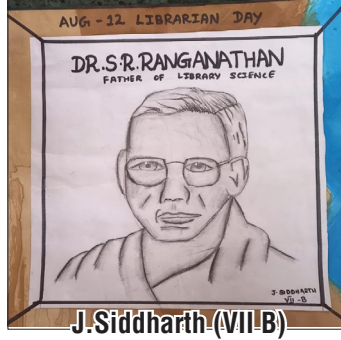
## Teaching with Tales: A Workshop on Drama and storytelling to teach language.
