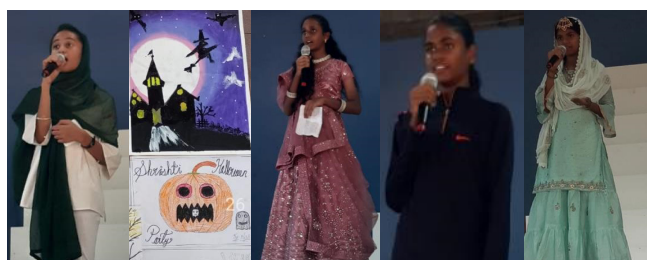

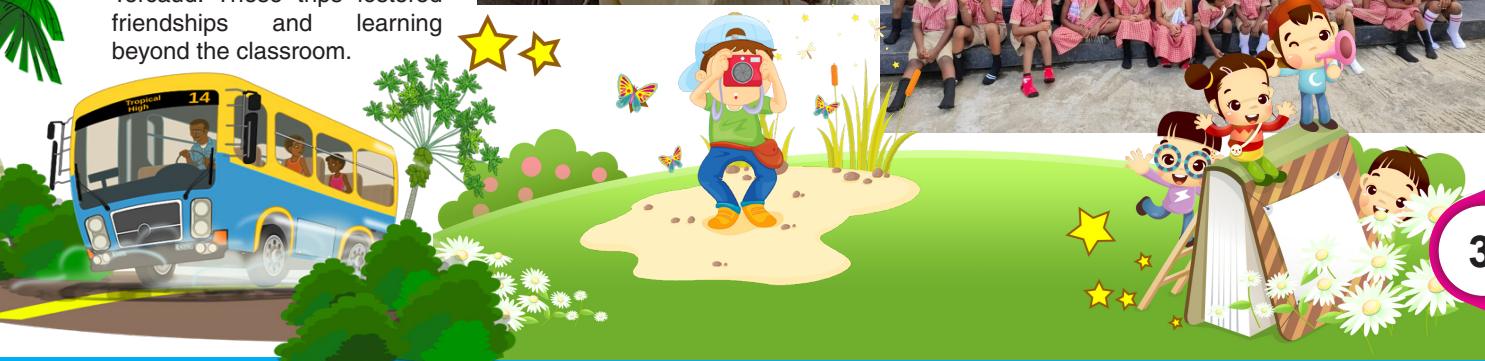


Adventure and Exploration Beyond the Classroom

Diwali Celebrations - 2024

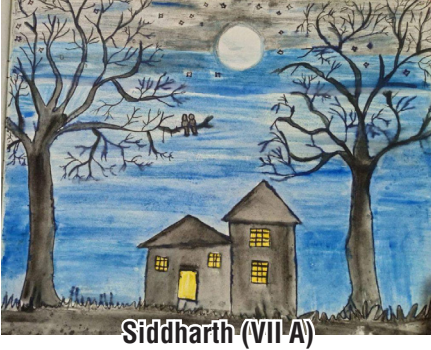


On October 10, Diwali celebrations were held with great enthusiasm and joy which brought everyone together to celebrate the festival of lights.

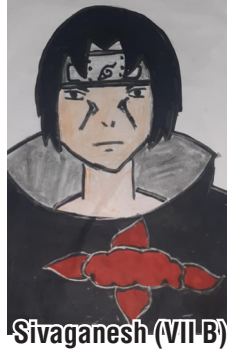

The Legacy of Durga Bhabhi in freedom Struggle



Durga Bhabhi, a courageous figure in India's freedom struggle, played a pivotal role in resisting British rule. Known for her audacity and commitment, she is most celebrated for assisting

Bhagat Singh's escape after the assassination of British police officer J.P. Saunders in 1928. Disguised as a couple, she accompanied Bhagat Singh on a train journey from Lahore to Calcutta, outwitting authorities and ensuring his safe passage. Durga Bhabhi's involvement in revolutionary activities began through her husband, with whom she became closely associated with members of the Hindustan Socialist Republican Association (HSRA) such as Bhagat Singh, Sukhdev, and Chandrasekhar Azad. She played a significant role in the Kakori conspiracy, where she disguised herself as a villager to aid her comrades' escape, even distracting British police to protect them. Additionally, she sold her ornaments to raise funds for the legal defense of Bhagat Singh and his associates. After the death of Jatin Das following a hunger strike in jail, she courageously led his funeral procession from Lahore to Calcutta.

In a bold act of retaliation for the execution of Bhagat Singh, Sukhdev, and Rajguru, Durga Bhabhi attempted to assassinate Lord Hailey, then Governor of Punjab, which led to her three-year imprisonment. After India's independence, she dedicated herself to social work, opening a school for underprivileged children in Lucknow. Her legacy continues to inspire generations with values of courage, resilience, and selflessness, highlighting the impactful role of women in India's journey to freedom.
