Unheard but Seen- The World of Silent Letters

The total becomes 100%

Go forth and conquer. We can't wait to see what you build.

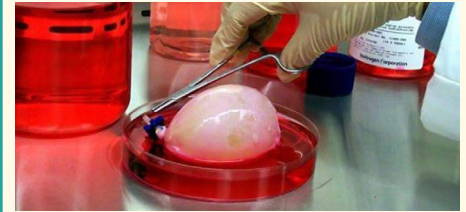

Science Breakthroughs

Lab-Grown Organs

A recent medical breakthrough is the development of lab-grown organs using stem cells and tissue engineering. Scientists can now create functional tissues like the oesophagus in laboratories and implant them into patients. This process involves guiding stem cells to form specific tissues using advanced methods such as 3D bioprinting. It helps reduce organ shortages, improves transplant



success, and lowers rejection risk since organs can be grown from a patient's own cells.

This topic connects to school biology: cells (Classes 6–8), tissues (Class 9), genetics (Class 10), stem cells (Class 11), and biotechnology (Class 12) forming a strong academic foundation.

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
